



FREE DISPOSAL OF CLEAN BUILDERS RUBBLE AT COASTAL PARK AND VISSERSHOK LANDFILLS

Free disposal of clean builder's rubble at Bellville South Landfill Site ends on 31 August 2021.

From 1 October 2021, Solid Waste Management will be granting accredited builder's waste generators and waste management service providers the opportunity to dispose of their clean builder's rubble for **free** at [Coastal Park](#) and [Vissershok](#) Landfill Sites.

This is a temporary arrangement for a limited period only. Waste generators and service providers will be notified two months (2) before the 'free disposal' period is discontinued or sooner depending on the capacity at the facility.

As communicated on the site notices, Bellville South Landfill site will no longer be accepting building rubble at the end of August 2021. This is in-line with the waste management licence.

PLEASE NOTE:

The City reserves the right to restrict/control incoming materials to our disposal facilities. Daily limits per customer may be implemented if the influx of loads becomes unmanageable.

Clean vs. contaminated builder's rubble

Clean builder's rubble is waste consisting of concrete chunks, broken bricks (clay or cement), sand, stone, soil, cement, plaster and other similar materials.

Contaminated builder's rubble includes paper, plastic, asbestos cement, other hazardous waste materials, wood, glass, ceramic tiles, metal and electrical wires.

The clean rubble is used to construct temporary roads on disposal sites so it cannot contain materials that could damage vehicle tyres.

This opportunity is subject to the following conditions:

- All loads will be monitored to ensure only clean builder's rubble is disposed of (See definition of 'clean builder's rubble above).
- All incoming vehicles with clean builder's rubble will be weighed before and after offloading.
- Builder's rubble must be free from any contaminants (See a list of contaminants above).
- Clean builder's rubble waste will not be charged for.

Contaminated loads

- If the builder's rubble is found to be contaminated by more than 10%, it will be regarded as mixed general waste for which you will be charged the normal tariff of R640.10 (incl. VAT) per metric ton, or R160.10 (incl. VAT) for a quarter ton.
- Disposal coupons to the value of the transaction must be presented for payment. These coupons can be purchased at your nearest [operational Walk-in Centre](#).
- You will have to transfer any contaminated builder's rubble to the nearest [general waste disposal facility](#) at your own cost.

We want to encourage all builders waste generators and waste service providers to use this opportunity to separate and screen their waste at source before disposal.
