PROVIDE SUMMARY OF HOST ORGANISATION / CITY

ILEA is a top class institution with outstanding Facilities and they involved 4 trainers from America, one trainer from South Africa, and one trainer from Malawi with vast knowledge on the subject matter and many years of experience in the field of Law Enforcement involving Wildlife Trafficking and money laundering.

4. OBJECTIVE

• To be able to combat Wildlife trafficking, the focus is based on taking down syndicates and kingpins.

- To solve a crime by collecting, preserving and processing information in a legal and systematic manner.
- To assist in prosecution of persons charged with crimes involving Wildlife trafficking.
- To equip and empower all those who are involved in fighting wildlife trafficking for the preservation of our Wildlife protected species.

5. OUTCOMES

- We have learned the importance of networking with our neighboring countries, as well as sharing intelligence with them as we became aware that a high number of our wildlife-protected species are shipped overseas to countries across our borders, with Cape Town being one of the main borders.
- Possible crimes implicated can also be money laundering. This can be fought with prevention of organized crime Act 121/1998 and Financial Intelligence Act 38/2001.
- We have learnt to identify ways in which fauna and flora are hidden in packages, which are falsely labeled to hide the illegal transportation.
- When encountering a poached animal, a uniformed member must approach
 the scene in the same manner as a first responder, which will be incorporated
 in the "First Responder to a Crime Scene" training intended to be provided at
 the Metro Police Training Academy, thus providing a return on investment.
- We have obtained the course material due to attendance and as ETD practitioners, we will be in a position to replicate the course and train our marine unit, alternatively any other unit requesting this type of training. Additionally, the course material can be summarized into a workshop for units dealing with anti-poaching enforcement.
- We have learned that wildlife trafficking is a global challenge that needs global partnership and participation.
- We have shared experiences and gained knowledge from other countries pertaining to wildlife trafficking investigation.

6. ACTIONS REQUIRED

Joint Operations should be conducted and liaising of Intelligence gathered with stakeholders such as Department of Forestry, Fisheries and Environment (DFFE); Nature Conservation City of Cape Town; SAPS Borderline; South African Maritime Safety Authority (SAMSA); Coastal Management City of Cape Town; Table Mountain National Parks; Cape Nature.

9. GENERAL DISCUSSION

This requires a joint effort through Joint Operations with multiple stakeholders. Doing surveillance and intelligence gathering from our side. Having a holistic approach as to who is involved and implicated, and then liaising and handing over of information (Intelligence) and cases to other departments in order to be able to identify and apprehend suspects linked to syndicates. Continuous surveillance and gathering of intelligence/investigation is required in order to profile suspects.

USA Act: The Lacey Act ("Act") is a comprehensive federal law that protects against wildlife crimes, such as international and domestic wildlife trafficking. The Departments of the Interior, Commerce, and Agriculture administer the Act through their respective agencies, i.e. the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Sers/ice, National Marine Fisheries Service, and Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service.

Steps to the Lacey Act: (Wildlife from our country and our country laws violated or US law violated) (Sale and transport of wildlife to the USA) leads to Lacey Act violation.
