PROVIDE SUMMARY OF HOST ORGANISATION / CITY

On the 07 - 08 February 2023 the Africa Center for Strategic Studies (ACSS) and the African Centre for the Study and Research on Terrorism (ACSRT/CAERT) convened policymakers, security sector actors, local authorities, civil society leaders and practitioners from across East and Southern Africa. In order to share promising practices, experiences, and challenges in developing and operationalizing policies and programs that enhance trust, cohesion and coordination among the relevant stakeholders engaged in Countering Violent Extremism (CVE).

This program is designed for security sector professionals, both uniformed and civilian, with backgrounds of backgrounds in the security sector, central government, local authorities, and civil society. Approximately 35 participants from East and Southern Africa (Botswana, Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Sudan, Tanzania and Uganda) were invited to the event. Institutions including the AU, IGAD, SADC, UNOCT, and UNDP as well as U.S. government representatives were present.

4. OBJECTIVE

Strong Cities Network is an important milestone in coordinating cities and b-municipalities to be engaged in the fight on the recent growing phenomenon of lawlessness and serious violent crime and for municipalities to get fully engaged in developing strategies and frameworks to deal with their similar challenges related to PCVE's in order to be able to counter and prevent manifestation of different hate crimes.

5. OUTCOMES

Cllr Mzwakhe Nqavashe attended the following breakaway sessions including full report back plenary which discussed, answered and provided proposed solutions to the questions on discussion points. "Notable" most of the recommendations as the City of Cape Town we already implementing most of these answers that seek to address the violence extremism problems that we face in the city. However, despite that, some of the African cities are still battling with these violent elements of extremists in particular in the East African region.

6. **ACTIONS REQUIRED**

The Safety and Security Portfolio Committee / Directorate to finalise its draft framework on countering and prevention of violent extremism in the City of Cape Town. Cllr Ngavashe to brief the directorate of the leasons learnt during this Ethiopian P/CVE trip. The Safety & Security directorate to continue being the champion on enovating the P/CVE early warning systems and a leader in being the best in the African continent in operationalizing the preventative strategies.

- 1. Cllr Mzwakhe Ngavashe to convene the directorate, brief and prepar it to host all cities within the republic of South Africa with some progresive B-municipalities across the crountry.
- 2. Cllr Mzwakhe Ngavashe to coordinate with the Strong Cities Network to have the Southern African round table session to be held either in Cape Town or Johannesberg and be attended by both the Southern African Cities from South Africa, Bostwana, Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Zambia, Namibia, Mozambique, Tanzania and Eastern African Cities Kenya, Burundi, South Sudan, Malawi, Ethiopia, Uganda, DRC Congo, Somalia & Rwanda.
- 3. To brief the Executive Mayor on the forum of Mayors to be held in New York in the United States of America, date to be set for August 2023.
- 4. Cllr Mzwakhe Ngavashe to encourage other Cities/Municipalities to take up membership of the international Strong Cities Network in countering and preventing violent extremism.

9. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Whereas the South African Police Service is failing on its constitutional duties to prevent crime and protect human lives & property in the Republic of South Africa. Such failures are leaving the City of Cape Town to prevent and fight crime with very little resources to confront alone given the high levels of crime. Coupled with poor safe keeping firearm SAPS 13, which allows for circulation of already confiscated firearms and ammunition, which negatively enhance escalation of crime in the City.
