# PROVIDE SUMMARY OF HOST ORGANISATION / CITY

The Confederation of Indian Industry, the Services Export Promotion Council and the Union Government of India, Departments of Commerce and Industry and Tourism acted as the host organisations.

The city delegate was particularly hosted by FAITH – Federation of Associations in Indian Tourism and Hospitality. It is a Federation of 10 national associations of the various components of the Tourism Industry in India. FAITH is the primary body tasked with promoting both inbound and outbound tourism in India. It has stipulated that its target is to double the number of International Inbound Tourists from 10 million to 20 million over the next 5 years and to increase the number of domestic tourists from 100 million to 150 million over the same period. The host organisation invited 182 delegates, buyers, interbnational travel and tourism media and key governments and speakers from 40 countries to help share their expectations and experiences to provide feedback and commentary to FAITH to assist it in its growth and development strategy.

#### 4. OBJECTIVE

The City of Cape Town was identified as a thought leader in Tourism in Africa and was invited to participate in the exhibition and conference at FAITH. However the lateness of the invitation meant that only participation in the conference was possible. It is important to note that the Indian government participated at both the Africa Travel Week (World Travel Market Africa at the CTICC) and the We Are Africa exhibition at the Cape Town Stadium. It was on the basis of the City's commitment to growing Tourism and Investment that the City was invited, by the permanent secretary Dr. Lalit Panwar who visited the Mayor while the exhibition was taking place in Cape Town. The Executive Mayor singled out the Indian stand for her visit to the Africa Travel Week and met with the Indian delegation on their stand.

The secondary objective to attending the GET India conference and exhibition was to make a determination as to whether Cape Town and Cape Town Tourism participates in next year's GET India exhibition.

The third objective was to reinforce the importance of Indian outbound tourism to Cape Town. Cape Town has experienced double digit growth, admittedly off a low base and has bypassed Durban as the traditional tourism destination for outbound Indians. This is largely ascribed to the predominance of a number of Indian films and TV series being filmed in Cape Town.

#### 5. OUTCOMES

The Indian government at the state level wishes to engage with the City on its Tourism Strategies for growth and development. The Indian Tourism industry wishes to engage with the Cape Town Tourism industry stakeholders for information sharing and for guidance and support on how to gear up for growth and address key customer demands. And finally the intention is to accelerate the growth of both inbound and outbound tourism with Cape Town and Cape Town Tourism. Since local government in India do not have a tourism mandate, the city's engagements would have to be via the state governments of Delhi and Mumbai. The primary reason for these two cities is that they have the largest concentrations of middle and high middle income households. Indian tourism growth sectors have been identified as Cruise lines, Adventure, Medical, Wellness, Film and MICE.

It is important to note that the following countries exhibited and had large government and business delegations. This is extraordinary given that SA, holds preferential agreements for bilateral trade and tourism and the fact that India and SA participate in the BRICS association.

- Azerbaijan, Bahrain (led by the Chairman of the Board of Commerce and Industry)
  Bangladesh (led by the Minister of ICT) Bhutan, Brazil (led by the President of the
  Brazilian Chamber of Commerce and Industry), Malaysia, Mexico, Pakistan, Russia,
  Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Turkey, UK, USA, Uzbekistan.

 Egypt (led by the Minister in the office of the President), Kenya, Ethiopia, Ivory Coast, Malawi, Mozambique, Nigeria, Senegal, Tunisia, Sudan, Tanzania, Zambia.
