The 4th Assises of Decentralised Cooperation for Development conference was co-organised by the European Commission and the European Committee of regions-

The "Assises" represented key moments for political dialogue between European institutions, the European Union and partner countries, together with regional and local authorities, to engage in development cooperation activities.

The aim was to contribute to the full integration of such activities in the European development cooperation policy and to build a true partnership between the different parties involved. This conference also served as an excellent opportunity for debates amongst various levels of government, and local and regional authorities.

The conference also allowed for the exchanges on the European Union's new approach to reinforce its commitment towards the local and regional authorities within the political frame of Sustainable Development Goals foreseen for September 2015 and in line with the 2015 European Year for Development.

4. OBJECTIVE

The City was invited to take part in the 4th Assises Decentralised Cooperation for Development Conference in Brussels Belgium. The City's attendance and representation at this influential conference on urban sustainability and local government empowerment represented a significant participation opportunity and created a platform for the City to be profiled as a global leader in this area. The conference also allowed for networking and developing potential partnerships and knowledge offered through the diverse sessions at the congress. Cllr Van Der Merwe gave a presentation on the keys to supporting the implementation of the international Biodiversity targets; Cape Town played a crucial role in facilitating the establishment of the original targets. Furthermore, Cllr Van Der Merwe presented on the City's 'Source to Sea' initiative, which is driven in partnership with ICLEI. Similar Source to Sea projects are being rolled out in Tanzania and Malawi. Cape Town, thus, represented the rest of Africa in bringing this project to light.



Finally, Cllr Van Der Merwe outlined the City's partnership with the City of Munich to the attending delegation; briefly touching upon the progressive nature of the collaboration and the determination by both cities to achieve smart, sustainable development outcomes.

In addition, the inputs and outcomes of the congress aligned with a number of the City's Strategic Focus Area objectives, including

Attendance at this influential conference on urban sustainability and local Government empowerment allowed for significant participation opportunity for the city to capitalise by utilising the space to strengthen its networks and relationships with prominent European Cities and also to further build on its existing partnerships with ICLEI. The conference was also used as an opportunity to attract investors and visitors to large strategic events, whilst promoting Cape Town as a model of excellence in innovation and government. Synergy also existed with the key conference themes being Urban Nature Capital, of which Cape Town is well endowed.

The outcomes of the 4th Assises Decentralised Cooperation for Development Conference aligns with the key theme of Globalising sustainability through local action in the post-2015 agenda, whereby the City profiled its support for sustainability outcomes.
