PROVIDE SUMMARY OF HOST ORGANISATION / CITY

The City and the University of Cape Town ("UCT")) entered into a Memorandum of Agreement ("MoA") in 2012 to establish a partnership known as the Mistra Urban Futures Knowledge Transfer Cooperation and Exchange Project. This agreement formalises a long-term partnership to ensure that the highest possible standards of evidence-based research, urban planning and sustainability practises are integrated into City policy.

Recognising that ongoing skills and capacity development, enrichment opportunities and incorporation into the global debate of City staff is essential if the City is to develop into global leaders able to shape the future of Cape Town, the MoA affords the City the opportunity to nominate officials to attend conferences funded by the Mistra Urban Futures Programme.

4. OBJECTIVE

- To present a paper reflecting on "Learning form Coproduction", specifically reflecting on his involvement on the MUF/CoCT/ACC Knowledge Transfer Program and the City Officials Exchange programme.
- To participate in workshops with practitioners and academics from Mistra Urban Future's other Local Interaction Platforms in Kisumu, Manchester, Gothenburg and Malmo.

5. OUTCOMES

- Mr Rabe presented his work on Day 1, in a session entitled "Learning from Co-Production". He showcased the City's flagship work on data-driven planning (known as ECAMP), and thereby promote the City as a model of excellence and innovation in government. The reception from the international audience at the conference was positive. Mr Rabe networked with a number of people afterwards to further collaboration.
- In preparation for the subsequent workshops with practitioners and academics from Mistra Urban Future's other Local Interaction Platforms in Kisumu, Manchester, Gothenburg and Malmo, Mr Rabe initiated a coordination session amongst Cape Town delegates to ensure that the message with regards to the importance of TOD research is received by the MISTRA funders. Mr Rabe thus supported the extension of the partnership which enabled the recruitment of a further two embedded PhD researchers for a period of 3 years focusing on TOD research.



 The most positive outcome however was the strengthening of relations between the City (represented by Mr Rabe) and the ACC.

6. ACTIONS REQUIRED

- City to follow up on invitation by Dr Warren Smit from the African Centre for Cities to provide input into the format and content of the MISTRA Urban Futures conference to be hosted in Cape Town in 2018.
- City to invite ACC-based experts to participate in upcoming workshop on resilience in infrastructure planning being organised and facilitated by Professor Dan Smit as part of the City of Cape Town's Medium Term Infrastructure Investment Framework.

work has received acclaim from the Cape Town Chamber of Commerce, the Economic Development Partnership, National Treasury and the World Bank, among others.

The success of ECAMP as an exemplary account of co-production has precipitated other areas of co-production between Mr Rabe and external stakeholders, such as concurrent urban simulation projects with the World Bank and the Centre for Scientific and Industrial Research, and the development of a Housing Dashboard with National Treasury. He also leads a cross-sectoral investigation into the infrastructure requirements and lifecycle costs for the city's future land use scenarios. As part of this work stream, Mr Rabe is working with local experts in preparing a concept paper on urban resilience to guide the City's participation in the 100 Resilience Cities network. As part of his proactive collaboration with academia, Mr Rabe lectures regularly to Planning and Property Economics postgraduate students at the University of Cape Town, as well as planning professionals.

For the reasons stated above, Mr Rabe was therefore uniquely placed to represent the City and provide input into the conference on the application of co-production of knowledge in Cape Town in partnership between local government, academia and other roleplayers/ potential contributors.

The reception from the international audience at the conference was positive. Mr Rabe networked with a number of people afterwards to further collaboration.

In preparation for the subsequent workshops with practitioners and academics from Mistra Urban Future's other Local Interaction Platforms in Kisumu, Manchester, Gothenburg and Malmo, Mr Rabe initiated a coordination session amongst Cape Town delegates to ensure that the message with regards to the importance of TOD research is received by the MISTRA funders.

The most positive outcome however was the strengthening of relations between the City (represented by Mr Rabe) and the ACC. Testament to this outcome is, firstly, the invitation by ACC's Dr Warren Smit for Mr Rabe's input into the format and content of the MISTRA Urban Futures conference to be hosted in Cape Town in 2018. Secondly, Mr Rabe has secured the commitment of a ACC-based PhD student Liza Cirolia to provide expert input and participation into the City's ongoing work in improving city resilience as part of the City's Medium Term Infrastructure Investment Framework.
