SUPPORT FOR TRAVEL EXPENSES AND CONFERENCE FEES RELATED TO THE INVITATION FOR MRS. ERIKA MOHR-HOLLAND TO ATTEND THE UNION WORLD CONFERENCE ON LUNG HEALTH 2023, PALAIS DES CONGRES, PARIS, FRANCE, 15-18 NOVEMBER

#### 2 FOR DECISION BY THE CITY MANAGER

In terms of Part 28B: Sections 16(2), 16(3), 16(4) and 16(5) of the System of Delegations<sup>1</sup> for the City Manager which reads as follows:

To grant authority for Officials to travel overseas for Council related activities.

#### 3 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

TB is a global health emergency and in South Africa and Cape Town it is one of the major causes of morbidity and mortality. The Union will be holding their annual Union World Conference on Lung Health in Paris, France between 15-18 November 2023, where various international stakeholders will meet to discuss and collaborate on issues and strategies, including implementation approaches to addressing TB.

The conference aims to create a collaborative space for engagement around recent TB research and innovation, and serves as a platform for learning about best practices regarding service implementation. It is an opportunity for non-governmental, governmental, academic, and civil society stakeholders to gather and share lessons regarding the implementation to strategies to address the burden of TB in their different settings. Thus, it will allow for networking in an international setting. The latest advances in TB prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and post-treatment lung health, including discovery, development, and implementation will be showcased for discussion. The TB community represented at the conference will be able to explore optimal strategies to advance our fight in the mission to EndTB. Staying abreast with recent and novel approaches to address TB in our community is imperative in making strides towards meeting the ENDTB Goals and halting community level transmission of TB.

# 3.2 Objectives of the Mission

The main objective of the conference is to equip non-governmental, governmental, research and the civil society with expertise, skills and strategies to support the successful achievement of the EndTB goals in order to reduce TB incidence and ongoing morbidity and mortality.

The Union will be holding their annual Union World Conference on Lung Health in Paris, France between 15-18 November 2023. For 53 years, the Union has been hosting this conference as an opportunity for various stakeholders involved in the TB response to come together to present the latest scientific research in all aspects of lung health. Generating new evidence from research projects and presenting the results or publishing them in a journal is not enough; implementation is required as well as translatable research. This conference aims to provide stakeholders with opportunities to engage around creation of evidence-based health policies and decisions regarding our TB response.

Clause 12.5 of the Cost Containment Policy states that "International travel must be identified and motivated with justification that the meeting/event is critical and in the interest of the City." This proposed international mission is indeed deemed critical and beneficial to the City as it will provide the representatives with an opportunity to collaborate on actions to improve the health of persons with TB, whilst also encouraging and maintaining strategic international collaboration through knowledge sharing.

This aligns to the core mandates of City Health "To provide a coordinated and integrated district health service for the citizens of Cape Town with adequate and equitable distribution of resources to render quality, comprehensive, cost-effective primary health care services, the City of Cape Town is committed to working with all spheres of government to meet the national, provincial and City targets".

The conference will provide exclusive opportunities for non-governmental, governmental, research, and civil society stakeholders from across the globe to collaborate with peers on actions to make strides towards achieving the EndTB Goals, strategizing regarding interventions to reduce the high morbidity and mortality associated with TB. Various panels and interactive discussions on evidence-based solutions to apply to challenges in addressing TB will be presented.

Senior Professional Officer: Epidemiology: Mrs. Erika Mohr-Holland (as related to point 10.1.1. of the Travel Management Policy) has been invited to present City Health related activities at this conference.

- Presentation Title: Rethinking reporting on TB outcomes: An urgent need to refine our programmatic monitoring and evaluation
- Key messages to convey: Reporting on the full TB cascade allows for better programmatic insights and planning. It is recommended that the World Health Organization and TB programmes redefine the calculation of TB outcomes to be reported out of the diagnosed cohort to accurately reflect patient prognosis, and improve programmatic response to gaps in the TB care cascade.

The travel management policy reads:

- 9.1 The number of employees (Councilors & Officials) travelling on authorised official duty for the same matter must be limited to three (3), unless otherwise approved in advance by the Delegated Authority.
- Dr. Kay Joseph will accompany me on this trip (a separate report is being submitted for this City Official due to the deviation route that must be followed)
  - Therefore, the number of delegates in attendance is within the stipulated limit as per the Travel Management Policy

In reference to 10.1.1 of the Travel Management Policy and 17.4 of the City of Cape Town Policy, there is no option of virtual attendance at this conference.

Mrs. E Mohr-Holland has received partial sponsorship for the conference registration fees and international flights to Paris, France (see Annexures D and E). This contributes to cost containment measures for the City.

### 4 RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommended that:

- a) Authority be granted to Mrs. Erika Mohr-Holland to participate in the Union World Conference on Lung Health 2023, taking place in Paris, France, from 15-18 November 2023.
- b) A feedback report for International or outside the borders of the RSA Trips is to be compiled no later than two weeks after returning from the trip and submitted to the Executive Mayor together with the Members of the Mayoral Committee, and to the relevant Section 79 or 80 Committee.
- c) It is to be noted that the total cost to the City equates to ZAR 38,318.51.
