Her funding for the project in Khayelitsha was provided by ETH for Development, an institution that finances high-impact projects demonstrating collaborative efforts between various entities.

#### 4. OBJECTIVE

The primary reason for attending the "Inclusive Cities: New Approaches to Understanding Infrastructure Access in Informal Settlements" symposium at ETH Zurich was to engage with leading experts and stakeholders in the field of urban infrastructure and service delivery. This event offered a unique platform to discuss and explore innovative solutions, particularly the integration of remote sensing technologies and AI, for improving service delivery in informal settlements. The symposium also provided an opportunity to present how AI could potentially be used for planning intergrated energy systems in informal settlements that are not connected to electricity in Cape Town, facilitating knowledge exchange and fostering potential collaborations.

The experience and knowledge acquired from this event will add significant value to the City in several ways:

- Providing exposure to cutting-edge technologies and methodologies that can be implemented to enhance infrastructure and service delivery in informal settlements.
- Learning from global best practices and case studies that can be adapted and applied to local contexts within the City.
- Establishing partnerships with international institutions such at ETH Zurich and stakeholders, which can lead to collaborative projects and funding opportunities.

# 5. OUTCOMES

ETH for Development is keen to understand how the case study in Khayelitsha has influenced the City's thinking about public lighting, particularly as reflected in the new energy strategy. They are also interested in how other organisations have begun using solar lighting in informal settlements, showcasing the broader impact of their funding beyond just the PJS informal settlement. Additionally, they have expressed interest in funding projects that the department is willing to explore further.

# 6. ACTIONS REQUIRED

I will prepare a brief report on how the department is involved in alternative public lighting in informal settlements for ETH for development. Additionally, in collaboration with the Strategic Processes team of the Sustainable Energy Markets department, we will discuss a range of potential research questions needing technical support, which ETH for development may explore for upcoming projects.

# 9. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Ms. Thandeka Tshabalala of the Sustainable Energy Markets Department received an invitation from ETH Zurich, a Swiss university, to attend a symposium titled "Inclusive Cities: New Approaches to Understanding Infrastructure Access in Informal Settlements" in Zurich, Switzerland from the 27th to the 30th of May 2024. The symposium aimed to bring together academics, policymakers, and community members to discuss new approaches to access to infrastructure in informal settlements.

ETH Zurich had previously collaborated in the Cape Town context, where two PhD students worked with the PJS informal settlement in Khayelitsha to pilot alternative solar-powered shack-mounted lights. The project in PJS informal settlement had been crucial in ongoing investigations into the provision of alternative public lighting in informal settlements. It had provided on-the-ground evidence highlighting key aspects to consider when delivering alternative services, including community participation and increasing buy-in for new technologies. It had also highlighted real challenges, such as maintenance requirements.

During the symposium, examples from Uganda were discussed, and Umeme, the energy provider in Uganda, shared insights into how they utilise remote sensing for the provision of clean cooking technologies in informal settlements in Kampala.
