1.25 Eligible property owners must apply for the rebate by 31 August of the financial year in which a General Valuation is implemented or within three months of implementing a Supplementary Valuation, failing which no such rebate may be granted. The CFO has the discretion to extend the applicable application dates above.

1.26 The City has determined a reduction of R435 000,00 (Four hundred and thirty five thousand Rand) which will apply to owners of residential properties used as a primary place of residence with a market value of below R5 000 001,00 (Five million and one Rand.)

2. CONSUMPTIVE TARIFFS AND CHARGES

Water, Sanitation, Electricity and Solid Waste Management attracts VAT at 15%.

2.1 WATER

Five levels of tariffs are recommended for the 2024/25 financial year. The approved tariffs align with projected sets of consumption levels. There is an approved 6.8% increase on the level water wise (no restriction) tariffs (including the fixed basic charge) recommended for implementation from 1 July 2024. The approved increases for the level 1, level 2, level 3 and level emergency tariffs are also 6.8%.

Tariff increases are predominantly due to the water augmentation plan to ensure security of water supply, water demand management initiatives, ensuring

the management of assets at appropriate levels, sustain and enhance the maintenance programs as well as supplying water at appropriate compliance, capacity, skills, service delivery and responsiveness levels.

There is an approved 6.8% increase on the level water wise (no restriction) tariffs recommended for implementation from 1 July 2024. The approved increases for the level 1, level 2, level 3 and level emergency tariffs are also 6.8%.

Tariff increases are predominantly due to upgrades and extensions to the wastewater treatment plants, ensuring the management of assets at appropriate levels (including a specific focus on the sewer network and sewer pump stations), sustain and enhance the maintenance programs as well as supplying sanitation services at appropriate compliance, capacity, skills, service delivery and responsiveness levels.

Below are the approved 2024/25 level water wise (no restriction) tariffs to be implemented from 1 July 2024:

Highlights of amendments for Water and Sanitation

- Refinement on the criteria for Social Housing Institutions to qualify for water and sanitation free basic assistance. Municipal property valuation per unit no longer required
- Forfeiting the right to basic water when customers make illegal reconnections will now also be applicable to indigent customers as part of the excessive use procedure.
- The conservancy / septic tank tariffs as tabled to the March 2024 Council meeting have been reduced by 50% based on the feedback received during the consultation period.
