Operation and construction of drop-off sites

The SWM dept. currently has 28 drop-off sites offering a variety of disposal services including chipping of garden greens, disposal of e-waste and garage waste, recycling and builders' rubble.

Sites are free to use for all vehicles with a carrying capacity of less than 1,5 tonnes. Each vehicle can drop a maximum of three loads per day.

Drop-offs are conveniently located throughout the city, so there really is no excuse for illegal dumping.
