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Glossary	
Notifiable disease	a disease that we are required, by law, to report to government authorities. This allows authorities to monitor the disease, and provides early warning of possible outbreaks.

Screening	a way of identifying those people who are potentially at high risk of already having or developing a particular condition.
Intrauterine device (UID)	(also known as a 'Loop') a UID is a small device shaped like a "T" that fits inside your uterus and prevents pregnancy by creating a barrier which stops sperm from reaching and fertilising your eggs.
Implanon insertion	a type of contraceptive device that is inserted under the skin on your upper-arm. It stops pregnancy by slowly releasing progestogen into the body.
Pap Smear	a procedure in which doctor or nurse uses a small brush or spatula to gently remove cells from the cervix. The cells are viewed under a microscope to check for cervical cancer or cell changes that may lead to cervical cancer, as well as other conditions, such as infections or inflammation.

Introduction

The following table is a guide to the services that we offer at our healthcare facilities. Take note that not all facilities offer the same services.

Primary healthcare services

Child health services

- Curative services for sick children (treatment of common childhood illnesses)
- Immunisation (vaccinations), weight and growth monitoring, Vitamin A and deworming
- Nutrition supplementation and breastfeeding advice
- Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission (PMTCT) of HIV

General services

- Mental health services
 - Assessment and management of persons who present with mental health problems and suicidal tendencies
 - Referral to the clinical psychology services at City Health clinics
 - Referral to psychiatry services offered by Western Cape Department of Health
 - Referral of children and adolescents to the Child and Adolescent mental health services at Red Cross and Tygerberg hospitals
- Screening for Hypertension and Diabetes
- Treatment of chronic diseases
- Follow-up on Notifiable Diseases reported
- Cancer screening
- HIV and AIDS:
 - Antiretroviral services and general care and support
 - Counselling and testing
 - HIV self-screening and Index Case Testing (at some clinics)
 - PrEP (Pre-HIV exposure Prophylaxis) for individuals who feel they are at high risk of becoming infected with HIV
- Substance abuse rehabilitation services:
 - Counselling and referral for treatment
 - Free drug and alcohol outpatient treatment at Matrix®-certified clinics
- Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs):
 - Testing and treatment
- Tuberculosis (TB):
 - Testing and treatment

Women's health services

- Basic antenatal care (care during pregnancy) and post-natal care (care after giving birth)
- Counselling and referral for termination of pregnancy (abortions)
- Family planning and pregnancy tests
- Intrauterine Contraceptive Device (UID) and Implanon insertion
- Pap smears and breast examinations

Men's health services

- Counselling
- Pre-circumcision checks
- Referrals to healthcare facilities where circumcisions are performed

Youth-friendly health services
