

# **Chapter 31: Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting**

## **1. Introduction**

The Integrated Coastal Management Act (ICM) requires in Section 49 (d) that the Municipal Coastal Management Programme (CMP) includes:

“(d) performance indicators to measure progress with the achievement of those objectives.”

Ongoing monitoring and reporting of the implementation of and compliance to the adopted CMP is an essential component of good governance and commitment to ongoing improvement.

As such the City of Cape Town will prepare a bi-annual (every two years) City Coastal Report.

## **2. Bi-Annual City Coastal Report**

The bi-annual City Coastal Report will include the following:

- a) Measurable indicators and reporting of the State of the Coast
- b) Record all notices and prosecutions served in terms of the Coastal Bylaw, the ICM Act or any other legislation relevant to the coast
- c) Record all non-compliance to approved management protocols
- d) Record all interventions related to any coastal emergencies
- e) Present the most current Coastal Risk Register

## **3. Ongoing Review of the Coastal Management Programme**

The City's Coastal Management programme will undergo formal review every five years as prescribed by the Act.

However, as it is considered a “living” document, individual chapters may be reviewed, updated, amended or added as the need arises. In this case, a review or addition of a chapter to the City's CMP will be done in accordance with Council processes and will include public and stakeholder consultation
